RDA Report

Dear Family,

Many thanks to the Big Rivers Area for hosting this WRSC. It is a pleasure to be here. This cycle I will be discussing the Traditions Book Project, Issue Discussion Topics, the Service System Project, the newest NA Way, and the Conference Participant Discussion Boards. Links to materials will be posted at the end of the report.

The Traditions Book project is underway. WSC 2010 adopted a motion to create a project plan for a Twelve Traditions working guide and a 2011 fellowship-wide literature survey indicated that this is an item that our members are very interested in: Over 80% of respondents said this was an item that was needed or very much needed.

Comments in the literature survey showed a wide variety of expectations about this topic. Some wanted something that could be applied personally, some wanted questions to be asked in a style similar to The NA Step Working Guides, some wanted to better understand the application to groups and service, etc. At the 2012 World Service Conference, we offered a plan for a two-cycle project, so that we can have more of a dialog with the fellowship this cycle about the focus and approach of a Twelve Traditions working guide before any drafting begins.

The creation of a workgroup, actual drafting of the book, sending the material out for review, and ultimately publishing an approval draft would happen in the 2014-2016 cycle, pending approval at the 2014 conference.

This is an important project, and we have the opportunity to get in on the “ground floor”. Now is the time to begin developing ideas and forwarding them to the BoD. The goal for this cycle is to gather fellowship input, source material, and ideas regarding a traditions book both online and through face-to-face workshops. There is an online questionnaire that can be filled out. The link is on the Traditions page.

There are three Issue Discussion Topics this Conference cycle. They are “Collaboration”, “Group Conscience”, and “Supporting Our Vision”. The workshop materials can be found at the link below. The workshops are designed to be 90 minutes each. These workshops also tie in with the Service System project. With the materials to be found at the links below, you should be able to conduct these workshops in your Area or groups.

The Service System Project is moving into a “field testing” phase. NAWs has asked groups, Areas, and Regions to try out the SSP and report back the results. Any groups that want more on this can find all

the information on the Service System page. (Links below) There is an item called “GSU Agenda and Facilitation Tips” that may help you develop ideas that could work for your specific needs.

The NA Way is celebrating the last issue of the 30th anniversary year of the NA Way. There have been 219 issues spanning 30 years. So, in this issue, they are reprinting some of the more memorable stories from the past as well as some NA Way history. There are some interesting statistics in the “Invest in Our Vision” section, and articles about the Issue Discussion Topics. There is section devoted to the World Convention in Philadelphia next year.

The Conference Participants discussion boards have been active. There are multiple topics and threads. Some of the most discussed topics lately have been:

- The direction for the Traditions Book
- Consensus based decision making
- The roles the Zones play
- Seating at the WSC
- RD/RDA elections
- CAR Workshops
- Regional Assemblies
- Group conscience
- Service System Project
- GSU models
- Keeping the discussion boards private

These are all valid topics for discussion by your groups or by this body. These discussion boards are open only to current WSC participants. This is to ensure that comments and ideas are shared freely in an atmosphere of open discussion and that none of the comments are posted elsewhere and taken out of context.

In keeping with the decisions altering the Fellowship Intellectual Property Trust made at the last WSC, NAWS has published ePub versions of the Basic Text, It Works, and Sponsorship. They are now available for sale on both Amazon and iTunes. (Insert endorsement disclaimer here...) The Traditions Workbook Project (TWP) is underway! NAWS has supplied a Power

Point as well as an instructor's manual and participant's work sheet. I have already e-mailed everyone a file of each of these. If you did not receive my e-mail, you can find these files at http://www.na.org/?ID=trads_project.

There are three links at the bottom of the page under workshop. You will also find an online questionnaire there also. Click on the questionnaire link to fill it out and submit. There is discussion board coming soon on www.na.org. This is what I propose: That WRSC hold at workshop at the next WRSC in January on the TWP and submit the input to NAWS. I was originally going to do this in July, however after consulting with the RDA, It was suggested the workshop be done sooner than later as there is going to be a lot of input on this from around the world and I would like to see WR as part of the pioneers of the TWP. I still encourage areas to hold their own workshop and either myself, the RD or RDA can present the workshop in your area. 2

TOPIC 2 – Literature/Traditions workshop during January's cycle. A Proposal was made to have the workshop at the Round table time at 2:00 pm on Saturday with a 1 1/2 hour time frame, passed.

TOPIC 3 – WRSC attendance at the WCA, discussed this issue. Harold read a summation of the SCA conference and the questions was is this prudent use of NA's money? Decided to put it in his budget, get the outcomes of the conference and look into other ways to contact these people in other ways.

TOPIC 4 – USSC donations do we want to fund the USSC? Discussed this, a proposal was made to give 5% to NAWS and 5% to the USSC of our donations after the suspension is lifted. Intent that the sooner the USSC is funded, they will be giving money to NAWS.
