## November 2021 Regional Report from Wisconsin Regional Delegate (RD) Team

Hello family,

Thanks for allowing us to serve this body. We continue to work to keep communicating and keep the flow of information happening.

Since we last met in September, we have attended the October Conference Participant (CP) meeting, we completed a survey monkey for dates that worked in our schedule for the abbreviated legal portion of the WSC in 2022. We will most likely be meeting virtually on the following dates for the abbreviated legal portion of the WSC in 2022 (this will include only legal matters that need to be voted through and the approval of the SPAD). Those dates are April 22, 23, 29, and 30. There will be a CAR coming out in November, but it will only have abbreviated information (FIPT info and SPAD), this will not be like our normally received CAR report. We will also be receiving a CAT in January that will give us the annual report information. There will be limited need to have CAR workshops as there will only be 2 or 3 items to vote on (including the SPAD).

In regard to the upcoming World Convention of NA (WCNA) in Australia in 4Q 2022, we have been notified that this will be cancelled. There may be a vote in the conclusion of this WSC cycle in 2023 to add another WCNA to include the Asia Pacific side of the world prior to 4 or 5 cycles from now. You can however, mark your calendars for the WCNA in Washington DC in 2024 (August 29 – September 1), please keep in mind this number of WCNA will most likely change to reflect the cancellation of WCNA in Melbourne. All is in place for this to happen and hope that many of you will be able to attend.

dezzz's other service positions. Currently, along with the RD position for Wisconsin Region, I hold the position of Vice Treasurer for Midwest Regional Service-Learning Days (MRSLD). I am also the secretary for the host committee for Wisconsin State NA Convention (WSNAC) that is happening in 2022. I also have been asked to be on a world workgroup for this WSC cycle named WSC Seating Workgroup. We have not met at this point, but I am grateful for the opportunity to be of service to this body. Other than those other positions, I have a home group 'We Choose to Live' and we meet every Wednesday at Noon. We have decided to remain hybrid, so you can come to the Gratitude club in Fond du Lac or log on at 703 877 2293.

The positions that Tyler currently holds are as follows: RDA Wisconsin Region, MRSLD Secretary, Miracles Convention Information Chair, North Central Area Public Relations Chair, and Treasurer for Vision of Hope Group Tuesday 8pm in Stevens Point WI. Tyler attended the MZSSNA in Texas and was happy to attend workshops to help him in his service endeavors to this region.

There was some discussion about this cycle of the RD Team going through until March 2024. After reviewing policy (WRSC), this is something that will be happening. Currently the policy states under 8.10 Election Schedule that the vote takes place for RD and RDA on non-WSC years, which will be 2024. We know there was some discussion during the last cycle, but are happy to follow the direction of our current policy (which did not change with the current changes waiting for approval this cycle).

There is a workshop scheduled for Friday morning on accountability and dezzz has been asked to run this workshop. Tyler has agreed to help with this. The region has also been given the time of Saturday from 1 until 3, this will be on the board for discussion.

We are scheduled to meet in January via zoom. The dates are January 15 and 16, 2022.
