## July 2023 Regional Report from Wisconsin RD

Hello family,

Since we last met in May, the RD Team has been quiet. There is a request to visit an area that is happening soon, and we will reach out to that area to discuss it with them so that we don't surprise anyone on attending an area. The area is happening in August and the RD has a commitment and will be attending virtually (if possible), however the RDA has not been informed of the date yet, so they be able to attend in person. As in all things in recovery, more will be revealed. Please remember that when the RD team is asked to attend a local area service body's meeting, it is not to critique or cause issues, but to observe and offer any input that we might have that could help that body.

Your RD (dezzz) has forwarded all of the regional convention information to the web coordinators to ensure that the dates of our conventions is on the calendar. Please if you are involved with a convention that happens in Wisconsin talk to your committee about doing this so it is not overlooked. We just found out that the Inner City is having a convention and got that placed on the calendar, but it is difficult for your conventions to get all the support you want from the region if other areas in Wisconsin do not know your event is happening. We have asked the web servants to do this step on their own, but it is a lot to coordinate. As we have stated, we are going to start up the RD team meetings again. We will be meeting the 1<sup>st</sup> Thursday of every month. We will be using a zoom account to meet (ID 703 877 2293), but you are welcome to come to dezzz's house to attend in person if you want to also (just know that we do have cats and dogs in our house, and it is their house also). If you want the address, let us know, and the meeting will begin at 7 PM on those Thursday's. We will do our best to run the meeting for no more than 90 minutes, with a preferred cut of 60 minutes. The idea behind this meeting is to continue to build our RD Team. What does this mean? It means that anyone who is interested in serving as an RD or an RDA should plan on attending this meeting, also if you have served in this capacity before and want to be involved, please attend. What we have learned through serving in these positions is that there is so much more to learn about the world of NA. We feel that it is important that members who have served in these positions before do not just take the empty spot when it is not filled (because we know you would do GREAT in that spot), but rather challenge you to get involved with the team to help the next RD Team to be successful and achieve much learning and experience through serving NA in that capacity. Right now, we believe that the focus of this team is on fostering and growing the future of NA, and if you are interested in helping us do that, we will look forward to seeing you on Thursday, August 3, or Thursday, September 7, either on zoom, or at dezzz's house.

Also, we are both unable to attend the region this weekend. Your RD (dezzz) is attending the 120<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Harley Davidson, and busy playing 2 shows with her bands, which she has warned you about not being here for months. And your RDA (Tyler) is out of state for a concert, but he may check in virtually from a hotel in another state if the time allows. ### **MZF (Midwest Zonal Forum) News**

Also, under the members tab we now have the current approved guidelines for PR and IT subcommittees (pending the full guidelines being approved) and the WRSC Helpline handbook. The events calendar has a new look and feel. This was needed to get around a glitch in the plug-in we were using.

These changes took a lot of time and effort on the part of our web developer and as the document library expands it will require more web space. It's time to start considering, where is the line between trusted servants and special workers?

Helpline: All our areas are being serviced by the regional helpline number, even those who do their own helpline. It works by the magic of technology. When someone calls any of our phone numbers, it forwards the call to our regional number. Then the system decides how to route the call based on the caller's location. It could go to either local resources for that Area, or to the Regional helpline volunteers. So, it is not routed based on which phone number someone calls, but rather on their location. This means your area phone numbers are not actually doing anything but costing us a monthly expense. Please check that you are using the regional number, not your area number, on your meeting lists, business cards, website, etc. As the redundant numbers quit receiving calls, we anticipate can be more prudent with addicts funds by retiring these numbers which aren't actually doing anything.

This has just gotten a higher priority because a new federal regulation will require us to go through a new registration/documentation process with each one of our phone numbers. This would be a great time to discontinue as many of the numbers as we can.

BMLT: The BMLT report follows

BMLT

Addict called Mike R. BMLT stands for Basic Meeting List Toolbox, fancy word for where we list meetings in the Wisconsin Region. As the BMLT Administrator/Coordinator for the IT subcommittee in the Wisconsin Region my main goal is to serve the Areas within the Wisconsin Region. If you are the BMLT coordinator or the RCM for the Area you serve, I am here to help.

Existing Groups

When a meeting of an existing group changes anything: (time, meeting format, address, room location, adds or closes a meeting) the process is to notify your Area's BMLT Coordinator, who will update the database. Do not use the World update form like we used to do. Updating the world will ONLY update the World, which would leave it out of synch with local meeting lists. Your BMLT Coordinator can update the Area (in those areas that use the BMLT), Region, and, after a 30-45 day delay, the World, all in one step.

New Groups

To get your new meeting listed, join an Area, and provide your meeting information to your Area's BMLT Coordinator. If you don't know how to contact the nearest Area, or you want your meeting to be not a part of any Area, contact the Regional BMLT Coordinator who will help.

RCMs

When I hear from a new meeting that wants to find an Area, I will put them in touch with the nearest Area or Areas. To do this I need to be able to get ahold of someone from the Area. Please send me your contact

information, phone number and email address. If your Area wants someone new trained to update the BMLT I can help.

#### BMLT Coordinators

Please send me your contact information, phone number and email address. If you need additional training on the BMLT or want someone else trained, then I will help. If you misplace your login credentials I will help.

#### BMLT Coordinators - Process for World updates:

NAWS updates their meeting list for the NA community around the world on a rotational basis every 30-45 days. If the BMLT Coordinator does nothing but update the BMLT, these changes will be reflected on the NAWS website and the NA meeting finder app in 30-45 days.

If the update to the NAWS website and NA meeting finder app need done in a faster timeframe, a BMLT Coordinator can contact NA World Services and the changes can be put in within a week. We need to provide them with the World Committee Code so that they are able to find the group in their database. For an existing group, the Area's BMLT Coordinator can handle this. You will need to provide the World Committee Code, which can be located on the basic information tab within the BMLT entry. If the meeting is closing, be sure to copy the World Committee Code BEFORE deleting it from the BMLT. Email the World Committee Code, along with the details of the changes, to [groupupdates@na.org](mailto:groupupdates@na.org)

New groups have not yet been assigned a World Committee Code, so for these meetings NAWS will only honor emails that come from [blmt@wisconsinna.org](mailto:blmt@wisconsinna.org). The reason for this is to make sure that the group will be synched between their database and the BMLT. So for new groups, the Area BMLT administrator can send me all the group information (everything that should be on a meeting list, group name, day, time, format, open/closed, etc) and I will arrange to have it added to NAWS database and synchronized with ours. This is only necessary if the meeting needs to be on the World meeting list in a faster timeframe. If you just add it to the BMLT, World will get it listed on their database in 30-45 days.

Big Rivers Area report July 2023

Big Rivers the 2nd Saturday of odd numbered months from 1-4PM.

We've been working on returning to "business as usual" with going to a hybrid format and the majority of our groups participating.

We were delighted to welcome 2 new groups! 12-Steppers meets in Prairie du Chien on Sundays at 6PM and No Addict Left Behind meets in Sparta every day Tuesday through Saturday at 5PM.

We had elections in June, and many positions are filled. We still need a Secretary and Co-Secretary and several subcommittee chairs.

We are working on a major revision to our Guidelines, since what we do and how we do it has evolved a lot since the last full redo in the early 2000s.

As we transitioned to a new Treasury team we had a bit of a surprise. The bank refused to let us change our signers because we didn't have an EIN number. This brought about a lot of frantic conversations and a very fast

learning curve. We want to share it in case it helps someone else.

Back in the 90s when our account was opened, EIN numbers were kind of optional and apparently like a lot of small enterprises, the trusted servants of that time opted to use someone's social security number. Banks take these a lot more seriously now, and we really DO all need an EIN number for our NA accounts. An EIN number has nothing to do with being non-profit, it's just an identification number. Just like people have a social security number, anything that's not an individual person is considered a "business", in banking terms, and has to have an EIN number for identification.

It's very easy to get one. It can be done online on the IRS website in a couple minutes or you can fill out a form and mail it to the IRS wherein it takes a week or two. Watch out for scammer websites that charge you a fee, you can do it yourself on the IRS website for free.

A side benefit was that this situation broke us out of complacency. While we were sorting it out we also moved the account to a different financial institution that better suits our current needs, which are rather different than they were 30 years ago.

From our experience, it would be worth checking whether your financial accounts have current EIN numbers, before yours also becomes a crisis situation.
