General Summary:

I have been working to make sure all the treasurer's records are up to date and ready to turn over to the next treasurer. Past Treasurers have maintained the records in Quicken. As part of my preparation for my turnover, I updated the Quicken with all the checking account transactions. I have spent a significant amount of time attempting to verify the ledger in Quicken was up to date and complete. However, there are some errors in the ledger which I have not been able to find. According to the quicken ledger the account shows \$2,730.12 when our actual balance should be \$3,020.59. Quicken shows \$290.47 less than we actually have in our checking account. I will work to find the discrepancy and provide an accurate and up to date ledger to the next treasurer and this body when I do my final turnover in January 2012.

NAWS update – WCNA Merchandise and Audio Recordings Deeply discounted merchandise from WCNA 34 is available online at <http://www.hicorpinc.com/na>. Audio recordings from WCNA 34 are still available for sale at <http://www.siattend.com/association.aspx?aic=NA>. Our event is challenging for any vendor to record since we have five locations at any one time running from 9 am to 2 am each day. It's made even more challenging by the fact that potential sales are increasingly affected by bootleg copies of audio files. In the past, our members have shared the MP3 recordings with a friend or two. That practice seems to have grown exponentially and members openly told our vendor at WCNA 34 that they were not purchasing recordings because they were so readily available online. This does not reflect very well on us as a fellowship and jeopardizes our ability to find anyone to provide this service for us in the future.

Membership Survey – Our membership survey is online until 31 December at www.na.org/?ID=projects. Please help us not only by completing a survey but encouraging your friends, home group, etc to participate.

Social Media Service Pamphlet – The delegate review period for the draft service pamphlet, “Social Media and Our Guiding Principles” ended on 31 October. We are making the necessary revisions to the draft and it will be available in its final form by the end of the calendar year.

2012 Conference Agenda Report (CAR) – Scheduled to be released by 28 November in English – translated versions by 28 December. The CAR is available for purchase from the WSO at \$13, including shipping and taxes. It is also available on the web free of charge from the link at www.no.org/conference. The user name is CP2012 and the password is WSC2012. The log in information will remain the same through WSC 2012 and conference related material will continue to be posted here.

The following is a summary of what you can find in the 2012 CAR:

Service System: The revised proposals, resolutions for decisions, and straw polls to obtain a sense of the fellowship wishes.

Living Clean: Material discussing our literature development process and the approval draft of Living Clean.

FIPT motions: We are offering motions related to electronic enhancements, bundling of NA literature, and corrections to existing material.

WCNA rotation: We are proposing changing the convention from every two years to every three years after 2015 and changing the rotation pattern.

IDTs: Material is out for Self Support, In Times of Illness, and A Vision for NA Service. We encourage people to participate in these discussions. See http://www.na.org/?ID=2011_IDT for more information on these IDTs.

Regional Proposals: We tried, as a conference, to experiment this cycle with regional proposals rather than motions. There are fine in the CAR as well as the responses from the WB.

USFA Tulsa: Motion one passed with 86% of the vote. Motions 2 and 3 failed with about 40% votes. A bid was placed by me to host the next USFA in Wisconsin. We won the bid. A host committee is being set up to work with the planning committee. Motions from Tulsa:

1. To have the next USFA in Wisconsin
2. Motion passed as amended: to create a USSC adhoc committee responsible to USFA Registered Groups. Begins at the end of the USSC and ends at the end of USFA III.
 - a. Tasks to be performed by the USSC Ad-hoc Committee:
 - b. To draft a basic statement of Purpose and Function for the United States Service Conference to be approved at USFA III.
 - c. To draft a Vision Statement for the United States Service Conference to be approved at USFA III.
 - d. To participate in the current service structure as best as possible.
 - e. Intent: To move this effort forward in a positive, spiritual, productive atmosphere.
3. Motion tabled until USFA III: To create a committee that is elected by the USFA for accountability purposed. The length of service will begin at the close of USFA II and end at the conclusion of the USFA III.
4. Four other motions were rescinded and/or deemed out-of-order by their maker & second or the chair. The USFA Planning Group of MA will work with the new Ad-hoc committee and the Host Committee to assist in going forward. Work on the USFA II – Tulsa minutes is underway. They will be posted online upon completion More will be revealed!!!

Dear Family, Thank you to Southeastern Family Area for hosting this RSC. On September 16-18, I attended the Midwest Zonal Forum at the CIACNA Convention in Indianapolis, IN. Among topics discussed was the Treasurers report. MZF has a total of \$548.60. The MZF has not received any contributions from Wisconsin Region since last January. That puts us at least 4 cycles behind.

Bob M, from Indiana, the current MZF web contact, has been nominated to be considered as a WSC-Co-facilitator for the 2014 WSC. This was endorsed by the entire MZF. The MZF is in need of a new secretary, as Dianne H has resigned for personal reasons.

The Wisconsin Region is scheduled to host the MZF on August 17-19, 2012. We are being asked to draft proposal in February. As this MZF meeting will be its first after the WSC, it will also be the planning meeting for the conference cycle. We will also be planning for a multi-regional PR/H&I event. It will not be in conjunction with a convention, so it will take on a format similar to our own RSC meetings. There

should be time for an afternoon workshop and an evening event. So who will host? Where? What Workshops topic? What kind of evening event? (put on board for discussion)

We also saw a first draft for a tri-fold information pamphlet for the MZF. It was discussed, and suggestions for editing, additions, and changes were offered. We hope to see an updated version of it in February 10-12 at the CAR/CAT meeting in Perrysburg, Ohio.

- ⌚ To ask for a time slot at the WSC for discussion of the USFA; this turned into a non-issue.
- ⌚ To use the MZF time slot at the WSC for discussions of the Service System Project. Result: No Conscience on the issue.
- ⌚ How to get members to attend service workshops. There was much discussion and many ideas were offered.

We will be submitting a budget for the February MZF CAT/CAR workshop as well as for the WSC in January. The CAR will be out by the end of November and Delegate Team stands ready to bring a CAR/CAT Workshop to any area. Please submit your area's request to one of your friendly neighborhood delegates.
